MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

COMES NOW PLAINTIFF CHARLES BANDY AND MOVED THE COURT FOR A TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER IN THE ABOVE-STYLED CAUSE ENJOINING THE DEFENDANT TOM F. YOUNG, HIS ASSISTANTS, AGENTS, DEPUTIES, AND ALL OTHER PERSONS IN ACTIVE CONCERT AND PARTICIPATION WITH HIM, FROM PRESENTING THE ACTION PENDING AGAINST PLAINTIFF CHARLES BANDY, IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ALABAMA, BEFORE A GRAND JURY, PENDING HEARING AND DETERMINATION OF THIS CAUSE.

CHARLES BANDY, TO A LEE COUNTY GRAND JURY, THEREFORE DENYING TO PLAINTIFF DUE PROCESS OF LAW AND THE EQUAL PROTECTION OF THE LAWS GUARANTEED BY THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES, AS MORE FULLY APPEARS FROM THE VERIFIED COMPLAINT FILED IN THIS CAUSE AND MADE A PART OF THIS MOTION AS IF HEREIN SET OUT IN FULL.
