



**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Court shall retain jurisdiction for the limited purposes of ensuring the Township makes prompt payment of the \$75,000.00 as set forth in the settlement agreement and promptly transmits all documents identified and marked for transmittal by Plaintiffs during the just-concluded document production at Township Hall, pursuant to the terms of the Settlement Agreement among the parties.

The Lowreys and the Township warrant, and the Court recognizes that this Order merely dismisses with prejudice the Township from the lawsuit; this Order does not resolve the last pending claim and it does not close the case against any other Defendants, current or future.
