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ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO COMPEL

This cause came before the Court upon Defendant Cedars Healthcare Group, Ltd., d/b/a Columbia Cedars Medical Center's Motion to Compel United Healthcare of Florida, to produce documents requested pursuant to a Subpoena previously served, ~~a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A,"~~ the Court having heard argument on this matter on September 5, 2003, having taken submissions from nonparty United Healthcare of Florida, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, does hereby rule upon Defendant's Motion to Compel production of documents subpoenaed as follows:

1. Defendant's Motion to Compel the production of documents subpoenaed is granted. The nonparty United Healthcare of Florida shall within ten days from the date of this Order provide to counsel for the Defendant the documents subpoenaed. Specifically, United Healthcare shall provide to counsel for Defendant all documents concerning Heather Rockcastle, formerly known as Heather Doan, Social Security No. [REDACTED], covered under Policy Group Name and Number Cedars Medical Center 34080, including specifically the following: (a) any and all claim forms submitted to United Healthcare for the period between June 1996 through

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
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December 1998; (b) any and all requests made or other documents submitted to United Healthcare by the insured, her physicians or others seeking coverage for and/or payment for and/or purchase of a wheelchair and/or motorized scooter for the period of June 1996 through December 1998; (c) any and all documents generated, including responses, denials, administrative appeals, etc., concerning any and all claims for a wheelchair or motorized scooter; and (d) any and all documents relied upon by United Healthcare for purposes of denying and/or subsequently providing a motorized wheelchair.

It is further Ordered, to the extent that such documents have been archived or otherwise placed in storage, that United Healthcare and/or its representatives, which may hold or maintain these documents, retrieve all documents and provide them to counsel in the time as set forth above.
