

3. Not later than 14 calendar days following the date of entry of this Order, the United States shall provide notice of the date, time, place and purpose of this hearing to all individuals who filed claims for relief;

4. Not later than 14 calendar days following the date of entry of this Order, Defendant shall provide the written notice required by ¶ 53 of the Consent Decree to all current employees and any non-claimants who have informed Defendant in writing that they object to the relief proposed;

5. No later than seven (7) calendar days before the date of the hearing, Defendant shall publish notice of the hearing pursuant to ¶ 53 of the Consent Decree.
