



3. Defendant, as represented by counsel, has expressed intent to review and reconsider Ordinance 2892 on January 22, 2007. That reconsideration will include, but will not be limited to the repeal, amendment, or replacement of Ordinance 2892. Based on this impending action, the parties wish to extend the briefing schedule previously agreed to and adopted by the Court on January 11, 2007.

4. This stipulation is being entered into by the parties by their duly authorized counsel and is not to be construed as an admission of fact or liability or by any of the parties.

5. Defendant shall refrain from the enforcement or application of Ordinance 2892 or any like version beginning January 22, 2007 or any date before January 22, 2007 on which the temporary restraining order in *Ramos v. City of Farmers Branch*, No. 06-12227 (116<sup>th</sup> District Court Dallas County) is lifted.

6. If Defendant intends to enforce Ordinance 2892 or any like version, Defendant shall provide at least 14 days advanced written notice to Plaintiffs in order to allow Plaintiffs to renew their Application for a Temporary Restraining Order. Defendant will not enforce the Ordinance until the Court in this case makes a determination on the Application prior to enforcing the Ordinance.

7. If Defendant subsequently provides notice of its intent to apply or enforce Ordinance 2892 or any like version, Defendant shall respond to Plaintiffs' Application for a Temporary Restraining Order within five business days. Plaintiffs shall reply to Defendant's response within two business days.
