The office of the U.S. Attorney, Phoenix, Arizona, has received a letter from NICOLAS ESCALANTE, the Mexican Consul in Phoenix, complaining that numerous Mexican citizens are serving time at the Gila County Jail under substandard conditions. He advised that he had visited that jail and verified some of their complaints. That letter follows.

Dear Ms. Napolitano:

At the request of several federal convicts, serving their sentences at the County Jail of Gila County at Globe, Az., I found that minimum standards for federal prisoners are not the norm. Among others things I found that the inmates do not have underwear and have only one uniform, therefore during the days the uniforms are washed they remain naked and the visits are rejected; many of them did not have blankets; they are not issued toilet paper, on a regular basis, according to Sergeant Mona Gomez, because the person in charge is "slacking".

The inmates did not have the forms required to request medical attention and complained that even when they have them it usually takes from 2 to 3 weeks for them to see the Doctor. I was personally able to verify several untreated skin diseases; inmates also complained that they only get a small tube of tooth paste every 3 to 4 weeks and that they do not have sufficient soap. All inmates in separate interviews complained that they usually get only 15 minutes per day on the yard and spend most of the day in their cells; although I was not able to confirm the allegations, and in paper the food situation seems to be alright, all the federal inmates complained about the small quantities of food and I was personally able to see that they were served rice that was either scrubed from the burned bottom or planly burned; inmates complained also that the commissary has not opened for 3 or 4 weeks and therefore they have not been able to buy things to supplement their diet or products required by the small quantity provided of soap and tooth past; several of the convicts complained that although their sentences have expired they are still in jail because the I.N.S. has not picked them up for the deportation proceedings.
