## ORDER

Upon consideration of plaintiffs' oral motion at a status hearing before this Court on September 25, 1990, defendants' opposition thereto, and the entire record herein, it is

ORDERED that defendants shall submit a detailed report to the Court on or before October 12, 1990 stating the defendants' plans for producing constitutionally adequate health care services at the D.C. Detention facility after termination of the current contract with National Capitol Systems, Inc. Such report shall include anticipated staffing levels, shift complements, governing medical policies and procedures, individuals actually hired by position, training and orientation procedures designed

to integrate new employees into the system, and all other significant aspects of these plans. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that a hearing to examine the adequacy of the defendants' plans for continuation of the provision of medical services after termination of the National Capitol Systems, Inc. contract shall be scheduled for October 17, 1990 at 10:00 a.m.; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that defendants shall produce to plaintiffs the following documents by October 12, 1990:

- 1. Those documents requested by plaintiffs' counsel at the depositions of Mr. Benny O. Hodges and Doctor Herman Branson;
- 2. All documents requested by Doctor Albert Raymond in his tour of the D.C. Detention facility, as detailed in September 14, and 19, 1990 letters from Edward Koren to Richard Love; and
- 3. Any and all documents in the custody or control of the defendants that have not previously been produced which refer or relate to termination of the current contract for the provision of medical services at the facility and/or any plans for the provision of medical care at the facility after the termination of the contract.
