Synopsis:

PAUL JOSEPH MYERS, JR., FBI # 141 497 J6, was confined at the Wyandotte County Jail, Kansas City, Kansas, from August, 1971, to February, 1972. In December, 1971, MYERS observed Warden PACHECO strike one inmate after attempted escape and in January, 1972, observed assault upon Inmate JOHNNY ANDERSON by two inmates. In October, 1971, MYERS knew of sexual assault upon Inmate ROBERT CARTER. PACHECO never made any statements to MYERS regarding any "cover up". GARY POWELL told MYERS he had been placed in Boy's Tank to show blacks and whites could live together. Jail problems were brought about by inmates in opinion of MYERS.
