ON MAY 10, 1979 I WAS NOTIFIED BY MR. WOODSON, OF THIS  
JAIL, THAT HE WOULD CHECK WITH MR BREEDING AS TO  
THE REASON TWO (2) ISSUES OF QUIET MAGAZINE HAD  
BEEN PLACED IN MY PROPERTY. HE ALSO ADVISED THAT  
A COPY OF LIFE MAGAZINE HAD BEEN PLACED IN SAME.

ON MAY 11, 1979, I WAS NOTIFIED BY MR WOODSON THAT  
HE HAD TALKED WITH MR. BREEDING ABOUT THE MAGAZINES.  
HE (WOODSON) STATED THAT I WOULD BE ALLOWED TO READ  
THEM, ONE AT A TIME, BUT THEY MUST BE RETURNED TO MY  
PROPERTY. HE FURTHER STATED THAT THIS IS THE ONLY  
WAY I COULD READ THEM AS MR BREEDING DID NOT  
WANT MAGAZINES CIRCULATING IN THE JAIL.

PLACED IN YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY. (RECEIVED 5-11-79)  
- PER MR BREEDING REGARDING INCOMING PERIODICALS.

I BELIEVE THIS IS ARBITRARY AND CAPRICIOUS AND FEEL, THAT  
SHOULD THIS CENSORSHIP CONTINUE I WILL HAVE NO CHOICE  
BUT TO INITIATE FURTHER LITIGATION.
