For the reasons stated in the Opinion and Order entered this day, the Southwest Virginia Regional Jail Authority (“Jail Authority”) and its officers, agents, and employees, are hereby ORDERED, DIRECTED, and ENJOINED from disapproving or rejecting the receipt by an inmate in a Jail Authority facility of the soft cover monthly magazine published and distributed by Human Rights Defense Center (“HRDC”) titled *Prison Legal News*, or the other publications published and distributed by HRDC as introduced by HRDC exhibits 2 through 6 at the evidentiary hearing held on June 25, 2018, on the grounds that such publications are printed on colored paper or are bound with glue and/or staples. In addition, in the event that the Jail Authority determines to disapprove or reject such publication on any ground in any instance, the Jail Authority is hereby ORDERED,

DIRECTED, and ENJOINED to promptly advise HRDC of the grounds for such disapproval or rejection and give it a reasonable opportunity to be heard as to such rejection or disapproval. This directive does not prevent the Jail Authority from imposing rules as to the quantity of such publications possessed by individual inmates at any one time, reasonably consistent with appropriate security concerns and facility resources.

The Jail Authority is further ORDERED to take all reasonable steps to promptly advise its officers, agents, and employees of the terms of this Preliminary Injunction. This Preliminary Injunction remains in effect until further order of this Court.
