AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES' JENA AGREEMENT

WHEREAS the "United States' Jena Agreement" was executed on the 13th day of April, 2000 between the United States Department of Justice, Wackenhut Corrections Corporation and Richard L. Stalder, Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections, and the Honorable Murphy "Mike" Foster, Governor of the State of Louisiana.

WHEREAS Paragraph 5 of that Agreement currently read as follows:

"Within 14 days of the execution of this Agreement, the Defendants shall comply with the following security staffing requirements at all times juveniles are present except as provided below:

- Eagle A 2
- Eagle B 2
- Eagle C 3
- Eagle D 3
- Falcon A 2
- Falcon B 2
- Falcon C 3
- Falcon D 3

Notwithstanding the above, staff assigned to these units must be able to supervise juvenile movement including out-of-unit activities on a proportional staff/juvenile basis.

Defendants shall ensure that Falcon building is supervised by an on-site Lieutenant at all times

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the juveniles are in the building and that Eagle building is supervised by an on-site lieutenant at all times the juveniles are in the building. Non-security personnel shall not be used as substitutes for security staff to meet the requirements of this paragraph."

WHEREAS the parties wish to amend Paragraph 5 of the United States' Jena Agreement to include the following provisions:

"The parties to the original "United States' Jena Agreement" hereby further agree that Eagle C, Eagle D, Falcon C and Falcon D may be staffed with 2 correctional officers from 11:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m., if the capacity of the dorm(s) is reduced from 40 to 32 (with a resulting concurrent reduction in the overall capacity of JJJC). The Department of Public Safety and Corrections agree to provide weekly reports indicating which, if any, dormitory capacities and staffing requirements have been reduced under this agreement."

Considering the foregoing, the undersigned parties to the original United States' Jena Agreement hereby agree, by this Amendment to United States' Jena Agreement, to allow the amendment stated above.


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
