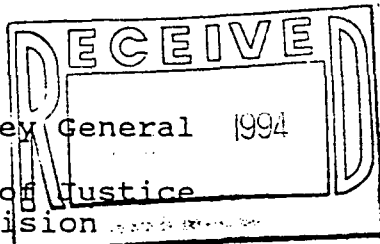

IMPLEMENTING ORDER 2

As further consequence of the defendants' failure to comply with this Court's Orders of December 22, 1987 and April 14, 1988, the Court orders the following remedial relief in addition to that ordered in Implementing Order 1, entered on April 19, 1994.

1. Effective immediately, all Youth House juveniles shall receive daily clean underwear and socks. Within 14 days of entry of this Order all Youth House juveniles shall receive daily clean T-shirts, and shall receive three times weekly clean jumpsuits and towels.

2. To ensure that juveniles receive clean clothing as scheduled in paragraph one above, and to avoid disputes concerning defendants' compliance with those schedules, defendants shall immediately implement a system in which juveniles must personally initial a form or paper indicating their receipt of clean clothing and towels. Thus, juveniles should initial their receipt of clean underwear, socks and T-shirts daily, and clean jumpsuits and towels three times a week.

3. Defendants shall immediately sanitize mattresses to eliminate crabs and other vermin each time a juvenile is assigned to sleep on a mattress on which another juvenile has slept. Defendants are prohibited from continuing their prior practice of failing to sanitize used mattresses before assigning them to a new juvenile.

4. At the next meeting among the Special Master, counsel for plaintiff, and counsel for defendants, defendants shall propose plans to accomplish the following: a) effectively deal with vermin infestation, b) obtain COTA training for all juvenile detention officers due such training, c) increase staffing at the Youth House, and d) decrease Youth House population.

5. Beginning on the first day of the month following entry of this Order defendants shall submit in writing to the Special Master, the Court and to the United States, monthly reports ("Monthly Reports") containing the following information for the previous month:

a) daily total population figures.

b) daily population figures for each unit, and the number of staff assigned to that unit per shift.

c) the number of fire drills conducted, and if partial drills were conducted, which units were drilled.

d) the number and type of pest control measures taken, including fumigation, rodent control, and so on.


e) the number of juveniles not provided with a clean change of underwear, socks, and T-shirt daily and clean jumpsuits and towels three times a week. Defendants shall attach to the Monthly Reports a random sample of the forms required in paragraph 2 above showing juveniles' initials signifying receipt of clean clothing and towels.

f) descriptions of all child abuse allegations including, the name of the resident(s) and staff involved, witnesses to the incidents, injuries incurred, and discipline imposed. Defendants shall attach to the Monthly Reports all internal reports of child abuse sent to DYFS for investigation, and all DYFS reports received by the facility.

g) daily summaries of the outdoor and indoor recreation time received by each unit.

h) a description of the status of the plans for or construction progress of the contemplated new Youth House.
