Dear Miss Woodruff:

Mr. Barrett has asked me to reply to your letter of November 18, 1962.

I am sure you will be pleased to know that the controversy concerning the Trailways Bus Terminal in Shreveport, Louisiana, has been settled and the City of Shreveport has been ordered by a federal judge to cease racial segregation at the terminal. Your testimony on behalf of the government will not, therefore, be needed.

Inasmuch as Government attorneys are not permitted to give advice or recommend lawyers to handle private legal matters, I suggest you contact either the Legal Aid Society or the Chicago Bar Association for assistance in your insurance problems.

Thank you for your willingness to testify, a mark of responsibility and good citizenship.
