Upon consideration of Plaintiffs' Motion for an Order to Show Cause Why the Defendants Should Not Be Held in Contempt, the Defendants' Opposition thereto, the Plaintiffs' Reply, and the record herein, it is by the Court this 25<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1997

ORDERED that Plaintiffs' Motion is GRANTED; and it is further ORDERED that the Defendants shall show cause on or before the 21st day of November, 1997, why they should not be held in contempt of Court for failure to comply with the terms of the remedial plan they filed February 21, 1997. The remedial plan was filed in response to this Court's Order of February 29, 1996, following Defendants' failure to implement the provisions of two consent decrees involving Plaintiffs' medical and mental health care needs. Today's Order gives Defendants nine months from the date they filed their remedial plan to comply with its provisions under both its terms and this Court's Order; and it is further


