ORDER

The parties to the above styled litigation have presented the Court with a Joint Request for Partial Consent Decree which would result in a settlement of the issues raised by the allegations in Paragraph 27 of the Amended Complaint insofar as it relates to visitation at the Penitentiary of New Mexico.
