

Pursuant to Rule 41(a)(1)(A)(ii) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the parties hereby stipulate to a voluntary dismissal of the case by Plaintiff Joseph Miller. Once this stipulation is filed, the case will be deemed dismissed.

Plaintiff Miller advises the Court that he was released from prison on June 9, 2009, and immediately went to Vancouver, Washington to care for his mother, who has multiple sclerosis and is a 100% disabled veteran. Mr. Miller is now his mother's sole caretaker, doing all the cooking and cleaning for the household, and he takes his mother to her doctor's appointments. After careful consideration, Mr. Miller has decided that the burdens of this litigation-- particularly the need to leave his mother for extended periods of time to attend depositions and trial--require that he dismiss this case.

Defendants stipulate to a dismissal of this lawsuit pursuant to Rule 41(a)(1)(A)(ii). In doing so, Defendants do not abandon their defenses to this action. This dismissal is not a ruling on the merits of the case. Each party will bear its own costs.
