**JUDGMENT**

Upon consideration of the unopposed Motion for Unitary Status and Dismissal [Doc. No. 119] filed by Defendant Jackson Parish School Board (“the Board”) and of the absence of any objection by Plaintiff-Intervenor United States of America to the dismissal of this action,

**IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED** that the Board’s Motion for Unitary Status [Doc. No. 119] is **GRANTED**. The Court finds that the Board has complied with the requirements of the Consent Order [Doc. No. 102] in good faith and that such compliance demonstrates the fulfillment of its desegregation obligations – the elimination of the vestiges of the prior *de jure* system in the remaining areas of student assignment, faculty assignment, and staff assignment – such that further federal supervision is no longer warranted. Therefore, the permanent injunctions and all such injunctions emanating therefrom shall be and are hereby **DISSOLVED**, and

this matter is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**.
