AFFIDAVIT OF GEORGE CARVER FONDEL

George Carver Fondel, being first duly sworn, says:

I was born on February 22, 1943, in Lake Charles, Louisiana. I work as an apprentice ambulance driver for the Gilmore Funeral Home in Lake Charles. I live at 223 North Boulevard, Lake Charles. I have a high school diploma. I am a Negro.

In October 1961, at about 11:00 o'clock one morning, I went with MacArthur Douglas to the Southwest Louisiana Vocational-Technical School to see about registering. We went into the registrar's office and asked a white man for application blanks. He said he could not give us application blanks because the school had not received court orders to admit Negroes as students. He also said that if he gave us application blanks without a court order the school would have to be closed. He didn't give us any blanks so we left.
