### Opinion

The motion of NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. for leave to file a brief as *amicus curiae* is granted. The motion of 17 Afro-American students who formerly attended University of Mississippi for leave to file a brief as *amicus curiae* is granted. The motion of petitioners for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* is granted. The petition for a writ of certiorari to the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in No. 90-1205 is granted. The petition for a writ of certiorari to the United States Court of Appeals Fifth Circuit is granted limited to Questions 1 and 2 presented by the petition. The cases are consolidated and a total of one hour is allotted for oral argument.
