ORDER

This cause was heard the 14th day of June, 1963 before the Honorable Bailey Brown, United States District Judge, upon the entire record, and especially upon the motion for summary judgment filed by the plaintiffs, the transcript of evidence heretofore introduced in this cause on 19 January 1963 and 15 February 1963 which has been filed as a part of the record, the brief filed by plaintiffs in support of said motion for summary judgment, and upon the statements, admissions and arguments by counsel for the respective parties, from a consideration of all of which the Court finds, holds, and DECREES as follows:

1. The motion of plaintiffs for summary judgment should be and the same is hereby granted; but the present relief awarded to plaintiffs will be in the form of a requirement that the defendants, City Board of Commissioners, etc., et al., and County Board of Education, etc., et al., file with the Court plans for desegregation of and elimination of racial discrimination in the respective school systems of the City of Jackson and County of Madison within the time and in the manner as provided hereinafter.


2. The defendants, City Board of Commissioners, etc., et al., will file with the Clerk of this Court not later than 20 July 1963 a complete plan for desegregation of and elimination of racial discrimination in the school system of the City of Jackson, Tennessee. The plaintiffs are allowed to and including

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27 July 1963 within which to file specifications of objection, if any, to said desegregation plan; and a hearing will be held on said plan filed by the said City Board of Commissioners, before this Court in Memphis, Tennessee, at 10:00 A.M. on Tuesday, 6 August 1963.

3. The defendants, County Board of Education, etc., et al, will file with the Clerk of this Court not later than 15 July 1963 a complete plan for desegregation of and elimination of racial discrimination in the school system of Madison County, Tennessee. The plaintiffs are allowed to an including 22 July 1963 within which to file specifications of objection, if any, to said desegregation plan, and a hearing will be held on said plan filed by the said County Board of Education, before this Court in Memphis, Tennessee, at 10:00 A.M. on ~~Tuesday~~^{Friday} 26 July 1963.


